"Highly respected for her local, national and international community service, Christine joined the Northumberland Hills Hospital (NHH) Board of Directors in October 2010 as a community committee volunteer on the Quality and Safety Committee," said Jack Russell, NHH Board Chair.

In June 2011 she became a Director of the Board, "most recently serving as Chair of the Quality and Safety Committee and NHH Board representative on the NHH Foundation Board," said Russell.

"Christine was deeply committed to quality patient care and good governance," said Russell. "Our Board and our community have been most fortunate to have had the benefit of her wisdom. On behalf of NHH, I extend our heartfelt sympathy to her family. Her model of dedicated service and gentle, wise counsel has made us all richer."

The Canadian flag is being flown at half-mast in front of the hospital in recognition of Christine Stewart's contribution to NHH. Funeral arrangements are in progress and will be announced by the family at a later date.

The hospital serves the catchment area of west Northumberland County.
