Service, innovation and leadership recognized at May 16 award ceremony, Northumberland Hills Hospital

NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY, Thursday, May 17, 2007 – The Education Centre was filled to capacity last evening at the Northumberland Hills Hospital as employees and their friends and family members gathered for the annual ceremony recognizing staff accomplishments.

Long Service Awards were awarded to employees with 10 to 35 years of service. Thirty-seven individuals were recognized in total, with eight of those completing more than 30 years of service at the Hospital! The complete list is provided at the bottom of this release.

Also announced were this year's recipients of the prestigious Leadership and Innovation Awards. These distinctions, given to two individuals, are awarded on the basis of nominations from within the hospital team, and acknowledge extraordinary employees who go above and beyond the call of duty to make a difference at the Northumberland Hills Hospital.

Jo Ann Poirier, a Registered Nurse, went home with this year's Outstanding Leadership Award. A key member of the Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) Team, a new unit of the hospital's Lakeshore Community Mental Health Services, Jo Ann has been involved in the development of a number of initiatives aimed at helping those with a serious mental illness.

The Innovation Award was presented to Carole Butterworth, a Senior Systems Analyst in the Information Systems Department. Since joining NHH in 2001, Carole has contributed her expertise and attention to detail to almost every software implementation undertaken by the hospital.

Education Awards were also presented to eleven individuals. In her opening remarks, President and CEO Joan Ross thanked the Hospital Board for fostering a culture that permits and encourages professional development at all levels of the organization. Awards were distributed for a range of academic accomplishments in health care-related fields, including completion of a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing and completion of Health Records and Occupational Health & Safety Certificates.
