Outbreak conditions lifted at NHH – Norovirus (Norwalk) confirmed as culprit that forced closure of two units last week

NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY, Thursday, March 26, 2009 – Northumberland Hills Hospital (NHH) announced today that an outbreak of a viral gastrointestinal illness is now over. Two patient units (In-Patient Rehabilitation and Complex Continuing Care) were temporarily closed to visitors, volunteers and new admissions on March 18, following the identification of a cluster of suspected cases.

The virus, confirmed on March 24 as norovirus, or Norwalk, affected 18 patients in total. Symptoms, which lasted for 24-48 hours, included nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.

Said Myonne Allan, Director of Infection Control and Laboratory Services at NHH: “While we remain vigilant, we are confident that last week’s outbreak has run its cycle. Norwalk remains in the community, however, and we strongly encourage visitors to refrain from entering the hospital if they think they may be ill. Given the fact that we may carry a virus and not know it, all visitors are reminded of the extreme importance of using the hand sanitizer provided on entry, again on exit and during their visit as required.”

Seasonal outbreaks of norovirus are not uncommon at this time of year, noted Helen Brenner, NHH’s Vice President of Patient Services and Chief Nursing Executive. “Norovirus is highly infectious. Staff members in the two units are to be commended for their efforts to keep this outbreak contained and for the extra attention required for the patients affected. Thanks too to the outstanding efforts of our housekeeping staff, for the additional infection control steps they needed to take to manage this outbreak, and the patience and understanding shown by our patients’ families in respecting our need to restrict visits.”

The affected units at NHH are once again accepting new admissions. Restrictions from patient transfers to and from other units have also been lifted.
