ADVANCED CT EQUIPMENT MINIMIZES RADIATION DOSE





ccording to Northumberland Hills Hospital Radiologist, Dr. Frank Marrocco, the 2009 purchase of the DiscoveryTM CT750 HD scanner "was definitely the right system for our facility. It's enhancing our diagnostic confidence across a wide range of clinical applications while helping us to minimize our patients' radiation exposure."

Since radiation exposure is used to obtain any CT image, minimizing the radiation exposure was a key consideration when planning for the purchase of the new CT equipment that was funded in its entirety by community donations to the *Care Close to Home* campaign. "It is especially important for the patients that require repeated scans," states Dr. Marrocco. It was this desire that led Dr. Marrocco and his radiology team to begin work on dose reduction protocols. Having the right equipment in place was crucial to the vision of maintaining excellent image quality but a much lower dose of radiation. The end result is that we now have a system that cuts dose substantially while maintaining excellent image quality for diagnosis.

"I am grateful to the donors and the generosity of this community is inspiring. I am humbled that the community entrusted us to invest their donations in this new equipment, and I am confident that we have invested wisely," says Dr. Marrocco.

The investment in this new technology and equipment, and in particular the MRI component of the project, allowed the community to recruit three new radiologists, each of whom is fellowship trained in MRI.



THE DONOR BILL OF RIGHTS

In times of increased public interest in the charitable sector, the Board of Directors of the NHH Foundation wants to assure you that our organization has approved and adheres to the following Donor Bill of Rights.

Philanthropy is based on voluntary action for the common good. It is a tradition of giving and sharing that is primary to the quality of life. To ensure that philanthropy merits the respect and trust of the general public, and that donors and prospective donors can have full confidence in the non profit organizations and causes they are asked to support, we declare that all donors have these rights:

- *I.* To be informed of the organization's mission, of the way the organization intends to use donated resources, and of its capacity to use donations effectively for their intended purposes.
- *II.* To be informed of the identity of those serving on the organization's governing board, and to expect the board to exercise prudent judgment in its stewardship responsibilities.
- III. To have access to the organization's most recent financial statements.
- *IV.* To be assured their gifts will be used for the purposes for which they were given.
- *V.* To receive appropriate acknowledgement and recognition.
- VI. To be assured that information about their donation is handled with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by law.
- VII. To expect that all relationships with individuals representing organizations of interest to the donor will be professional in nature.
- VIII. To be informed whether those seeking donations are volunteers, employees of the organization or hired solicitors.
- IX. To have the opportunity for their names to be deleted from mailing lists that an organization may intend to share.
- X. To feel free to ask questions when making a donation and to receive prompt, truthful and forthright answers.


