

Patients, staff enjoy work of local artists thanks to new Arts Council of Northumberland exhibit

Thanks to a new Arts Council of Northumberland initiative, watercolors, acrylics and photographs are among the different art forms now on display along Sumac Street, on the main floor of Northumberland Hills Hospital (NHH).

In place at the Hospital through May 9th, 2012, the colourful and engaging exhibit is a joint venture between the NHH Foundation and the Arts Council of Northumberland's *Art in Public Spaces* program.

Championed by Heather Roy, Council member, artist and local teacher, the program is one of the Council's latest achievements against a mission "to encourage creativity and raise the visibility of the artist and the arts community through advocacy, communication and leadership."

"We are very happy to bring these pieces to NHH," said Ms. Roy. "In the context of our Council's vision and mission, NHH is a natural venue for County artists because it is frequented by Northumberland residents and because of the Hospital's strong commitment to serving its community."

Visitors can enjoy them in place or, if inspired by the work, consider purchasing a piece for their home or business. Prices range from \$100 upward.

The *Art in Public Spaces* program was initiated in the fall of 2010 with the Northumberland County building at 600 William Street in Cobourg, where artwork is also presently on display. Other exhibit locations in the region are in

Quality Improvement Plan 2012-13 Message from Robert Biron, President and CEO

In 2010, the Ontario Government passed the Excellent Care for All Act (ECFAA). One of the ways that ECFAA is helping hospitals meet their community's expectations regarding quality, patient safety and accountability is through the public reporting of annual **Quality Improvement Plans**, or QIPs.

NHH's first QIP (2011-12) was published at this time last year on our public website (www.nhh.ca). On April 1st, NHH released its second annual QIP for 2012-13, together with a progress report against our first-year Plan.

Overall, NHH had a very good year – we implemented many new initiatives and continued to perform well in terms of quality, wait times and patient safety. Our new Plan builds on this work, with the following identified as key goals for 2012-13:

- improved hand hygiene practices;
- safe mobility for our patients to reduce falls;
- reducing wait times and improving patient satisfaction in the Emergency Department; and,
- reducing readmission rates.

Grounded in a philosophy of continuous improvement, NHH's quality goals are monitored closely throughout the year by our program committees, management team, medical staff and our Board. With a collective focus on specific, shared goals, we look forward to building on the past year's progress and continuing to enhance quality at NHH.
