## **FULL HOUSE FOR AREA'S FIRST** LOOK GOOD FEEL BETTER WORKSHOP

Thanks to the efforts of Chemotherapy Clinic RN Kim Baxter, NHH recently hosted a successful pilot of the popular Look Good Feel Better program for women experiencing appearancerelated side effects of cancer treatment.

With the help of NHH's link to a distance education service offered through the Ontario Telemedicine Network, Kim is working part time on a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing from Ryerson University. This year, one of her courses required her to map out a learning plan to reach a goal identified in her nursing practice.

"The goal I identified was a need to bring this wonderful workshop closer to home to help our patients feel better at a time when body image and often self-esteem are greatly altered. Seeing that the program had not come to our area in the past, I decided to see if it could be coordinated."

Look Good Feel Better (LGFB) is a national public-service program run by the Canadian Cosmetic, Toiletry and Fragrance Association (CCTFA) through its charitable organization, the CCTFA Foundation. Typically held in larger centres, this was the program's first offering in west Northumberland.

Fourteen local women enjoyed the free two-hour workshop with a team of LGFB

volunteers on Friday, July 23rd in the NHH Education Centre. Professional instruction was provided on techniques for skin care and cosmetics during and after chemotherapy, and advice on attractive hair alternatives was shared. A personal product kit was given to each participant at the end of the two-

hour session, compliments of the CCTFA Foundation.

LGFB is now considering running regular sessions in the area throughout the year. For information, please contact Kim Baxter at kbaxter@nhh.ca or 905-377-7730.





## NHH TO ADD SURGICAL SAFETY CHECKLIST **COMPLIANCE TO LIST OF QUALITY INDICATORS** TRACKED ON PUBLIC WEBSITE

Our patients and community will soon have a new tool for assessing surgical operations at our hospital and others around the province.

Beginning this Friday, July 30th, NHH's compliance rate for the use of a standardized surgical safety checklist will be posted on NHH's website, www.nhh.ca.

The Surgical Safety Checklist (SSC) is a tool used by the team of operating room professionals (surgeons, nurses, anesthesiologists and others) to discuss important details about a surgical case at three distinct stages of the procedure: pre-induction (before the patient is put to sleep), time out (before the procedure begins) and debriefing (during or after surgical closure).

Building on existing safety procedures in the surgical suites, NHH began using the new SSC tool earlier this year. NHH's compliance for the first reporting period (April through June 2010) is 100%. 4,748 surgical cases were completed at NHH in the last fiscal year.

SSC joins eight other patient safety indicators the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care introduced at hospitals since the fall of 2008. Also tracked for public review are the rates of certain infections, such as C. difficile, and hand hygiene compliance with an aim to identify trends and monitor performance over time. Public reporting of key indicators, using a consistent methodology, is beneficial because it allows hospitals to work with a standardized reporting approach across the province, establish a common baseline and track rates over time.
