Spotlight on NHH's Community Mental Health Services: Local Access, Regional Expertise, World Class Care

It was just one short year ago that the Board of Directors of the Central East Local Health Integration Network (Central East LHIN) approved an innovative voluntary integration between the Ontario Shores Centre for Mental Health Sciences and NHH's Community Mental Health Program, but the impact on patient care in our area has been dramatic.

The collaboration, encouraged and endorsed by both hospitals' boards, allowed for the smaller community mental health program at NHH to gain access to the specialty services of a larger mental health centre. Using an integrated program management model, Ontario Shores now provides leadership and management services to NHH's Mental Health Program. For clients at NHH this has translated into more timely access to psychiatry and specialized mental health treatment that had previously been unattainable due to either distance or a local gap in service.

Ontario Shores facilitated the implementation of best practices, increased clinical accountability, access to specialized mental health services and decreased fragmentation of care. Says Helen Brenner, Vice President, Patient Services and Chief Nursing Executive at NHH,

"We're extremely pleased with the results of this collaboration. Even though the new management model has only been in place for a year, we're seeing substantial improvement in access to service, increased service volumes, decreased wait times and increased satisfaction and retention of staff without the requirement of any additional funding."


Scott Pepin, the cross-appointed Director of Mental Health Services for NHH and Ontario Shores, is also very satisfied with the early outcomes of his team's efforts. Speaking to some specific examples of enhancements, he lists the following:

- a redesign of the intake process within the NHH Mental Health Program that has increased client access to mental health services:
- new access for NHH staff and physicians to specialized mental health and psychiatric consultation at Ontario Shores in the areas of adolescence and metabolic management;
- improved use of the Ontario Telemedicine Network video technology to connect patients and clinicians between remote sites;
- staff access to specialized training at Ontario Shores; and
- a new crisis intervention model designed and implemented in NHH's Emergency Department.

Since the beginning of the partnership, treatment contacts have increased for NHH's Mental Health Program by 74 per cent. "That's a remarkable net increase", said Dr. David Broderick, Chief of Staff, an unquestionable leap forward for the long-term sustainability of this much-needed program in our west Northumberland region. With a team of 23 staff and six psychiatrists, the program provides treatment and support for individuals experiencing depression; bipolar disorder; anxiety; phobias and panic disorder; traumatic stress; schizophrenia and other psychotic disorders; personality disorders; and mental health crises. Self-referrals are accepted, as are referrals from family physicians and community agencies. NHH looks forward to building on Bike to Work Day in the years ahead as one of many programs underway to support a "healthy hospital" culture promoting environmentally responsible choices.
