90 staff members and community physicians were recognized for achievements in service, education and leadership last week at Northumberland Hills Hospital's annual staff recognition ceremony. We had so many individuals to recognize in our 10th anniversary year, we had to split the evening into two two-hour parts to accommodate the large crowd!

This was my first staff award ceremony since stepping into the role of President and CEO. It is clearly a very important tradition here at NHH. As I shared with the guests, we recognized—combined—more than 1,180 years of service to this hospital, in addition to other awards for leadership, innovation and education. OTN Coordinator Patti Ley was recognized with this year's Outstanding Leadership Award for her work expanding our OTN program here at NHH.

We had one 30-year pin recipient this year, and two each in the 35 and 40 year categories. Very special congratulations go out to Pam Oakman (30 years), Brenda Ough and Mary Anne Shaw (35 years) and Nancy Linton and Louise Rusk (40 years).

I particularly enjoyed hearing the personal anecdotes about each recipient. We rarely have an opportunity like that to get a glimpse of what makes each staff member special to their respective team and, by extension, the entire hospital. Also a pleasure for me was the chance to meet spouses and family members of the recipients. As we all know, our families support us in our work each and every day and I was very happy to see so many come out for this event.
