Quality and Safety

Pilot project now collecting real time patient experience/satisfaction feedback

NHH has introduced real-time patient experience surveys in two pilot areas of the hospital: the Emergency Department and Medical/Surgical unit (2B). The surveys have been co-designed in consultation with the Patient and Family Advisory Council and staff.

Launched June 4th, the surveys are now being tested with the aim of completing 40 surveys (20 in each area) by month's end. NHH Auxiliary volunteers, PFAC members and selected staff will be distributing the surveys in the two units selected for the pilot. Paper-based surveys are in place for now, though the aim, in the longer term, is to explore electronic options. Patients are being offered a variety of options to complete the paper survey: one-on-one survey completion, leave & pick-up or leave & drop-off at their unit's nursing station.

The goal of the trial is to identify lessons learned and opportunities to improve the survey process, if necessary. Lessons learned on both the survey mechanics and the input gathered will be reviewed and incorporated into a longer-term process in the coming year.

Long-form NRC mailed out surveys, coordinated through the third party NRC, will continue. The real-time feedback is a new and valuable opportunity to gather feedback from patients and address any concerns immediately, as required.

In the event of rain it will be moved inside, to the Main Street Bistro. Indigenous food samples will be served throughout, thanks to the team at Alderville.
