Fast Facts about Ontario's Doctors (from the Ontario Medical Association)

- Number of practicing physicians in Ontario: approximately 31,500
- Number of specialists: 15,700

- Number of General and Family practitioners: 14.800
- Number of medical students: 3,400
- Number of residents: 4,600
- Number of specialty areas of medicine: 47 ranging from medical oncology to public health
- Average number of years to complete medical education: 8-12 years, plus ongoing, mandatory continuing professional development courses
- Ontario's doctors treat approximately 340,000 patients each day and approximately 6.3+ million in emergency departments each year
- Each physician's office (through overhead) contributes the equivalent of 4 full-time jobs in their community, generates \$205,000 in GDP, and generates \$50,000 in tax revenue for the municipal, provincial and federal governments

About Northumberland Hills Hospital (NHH) – Located approximately 100 kilometres east of Toronto, NHH delivers a broad range of acute, post-acute, outpatient and diagnostic services. Acute services include emergency and intensive care, medical/surgical care, obstetrical care and palliative care. Post-acute specialty services (PASS) include restorative care and rehabilitation. Mental health care, chemotherapy, dialysis and 16 other ambulatory care clinics are offered on an outpatient basis through partnerships with regional centres and nearby specialists. NHH offers a full range of diagnostic services, including magnetic resonance imaging (MRI), computed tomography (CT) and mammography. The hospital serves the catchment area of west Northumberland County. A mixed urban and rural population of approximately 60,000 residents, west Northumberland comprises the Town of Cobourg, the Municipality of Port Hope and the townships of Hamilton, Cramahe and Alnwick/Haldimand. NHH employs approximately 600 people and relies on the additional support provided by physicians and volunteers. NHH is an active member of the Central East Local Health Integration Network.
