It's a girl! First baby of the new year welcomed at NHH at 4:53 AM, January 1

NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY, Tuesday, January 3rd, 2017 – Northumberland Hills Hospital (NHH) welcomed its first baby of the new year at 4:53 AM on Sunday, January 1st, 2017. First child for Julia and Kevin Clarkson of Bowmanville, the baby—named Hannah—weighed 6 pounds and 3 ounces (2,810 grams).

The Brahms Iullaby was heard in the NHH hallways close to 500 times in the last fiscal year. With six birthing suites, a dedicated operating room for caesarean sections and an experienced health care team, NHH provides newborns and their families with the personal and exceptional care expected of a community hospital. More than 500 births are anticipated in the current fiscal year, thanks to a strong and expanding partnership with local family physicians, and a growing number of obstetrician-gynecologists and midwives working at NHH.

The hospital serves the catchment area of west Northumberland County.
