The health care team in NHH's Cobourg Lions and Lioness Cancer and Supportive Care Clinic provides care for cancer patients living in the surrounding communities in partnership with the Durham Regional Cancer Centre (DRCC) at Lakeridge Health, the Central East Regional Cancer Program and Cancer Care Ontario. Services offered at NHH include the delivery of chemotherapy, biotherapy and supportive treatments, as well as education, palliative care, symptom and pain management.
