## Tips for the Responsible Hospital Visitor

In recent years, the Northumberland Hills Hospital has made changes to its patient visitation guidelines in order to better control the spread of infectious illness.

Here are a few things to think about the next time you visit someone in the hospital:

- Visit patients from 2 p.m. and 8 p.m. when most patient tests have been completed for the day.
- Refrain from visiting the hospital if you feel unwell, particularly if you are coughing, sneezing, have a runny nose, sore throat, fever or nausea and diarrhea.
- Take the time to carefully read any visitor information posted at hospital entrances and follow the guidelines.
- Wash your hands thoroughly using the hand sanitizer provided at each entrance of the hospital.
- Avoid bringing small children to the hospital during visitations; if you must bring along small children, please keep an eye on them.
- Gifts are always appreciated by patients, however, it's best to do your homework beforehand. Some patients have diet restrictions during their hospital stay, while others may share a room with an individual with allergies.
- When choosing a floral bouquet for a patient, please consider a non-fragrant variety (i.e. tulips, chrysanthemums, carnations, gerbera, snapdragons) out of consideration for other patients who may be allergic to strong fragrances.
- Consider bringing flowers to the hospital in a vase rather than a basket filled with foam; floral arrangements last longer and require less care when presented in a vase.
- When purchasing balloons for a hospital patient, please choose Mylar balloons only, as the hospital has a no-latex policy (due to patient allergies).
- Respect the privacy of other hospital patients, and any requests made by hospital staff.
- Keep in mind that all patients need their rest, so short, frequent visits are better than one long visit.
- Please note the Northumberland Hills Hospital and its grounds are smoke-free.
- Visitor parking is located across from the hospital's main entrance, and is available at a cost of \$4 per visit. Monthly discount parking cards are available for those family members visiting the hospital on a more frequent basis. Please refrain from parking in the short-term parking area when visiting patients; these areas are reserved for physicians responding to patient emergencies and for patient drop-off only.
